Traveling to Patras

1. From Athens International Airport "El. Venizelos".

Visitors arriving at Athens airport can reach Patras by bus, by train or by car.

By car

There are a lot of companies renting cars in Athens International Airport. It will take you 2,5 hours to come to Patras. The road is a good one. We recommend this option especially if you travel two or three persons together.

By train and bus

From the El. Venizelos airport take the suburban rail to Piraeus. Change train in the station "Kato Acharnes" for Kiato. It will take 3 minutes waiting and the train comes in the same platform. From Kiato there is a corresponding bus to Patras. The Patras' train station is at the center of the city. This is the most convenient and cheapest way to come from Athens Airport to Patras.

By bus

From El. Venizelos airport, take the express bus X93 (outside door 5). It runs every 35 minutes (every 60 minutes at night). The ticket price is 6.00 \in and you can buy it from a small sidewalk kiosk near door 5. When you get on the bus, you must validate your ticket using the validation machine next to the bus driver. The express bus takes you to the intercity coach station called "KTEL Peloponissou" (last stop of the route) after about 50 minutes, at 100 Kifissou Str. As soon as you arrive there, you can get from the info-ticket desk a ticket to Patras (" Π ATPA"). One way ticket costs 18.90 \in . The first morning bus departs at 05:30 a.m. and the last night bus at 22:00 p.m. The frequency of departures is about every half hour Mon-Sat and less frequent on Sundays. Keep in mind that bus routes marked EXPRESS go to Patras directly from Athens, without making intermediate stops, so it worth's waiting half an hour to board on express bus.

In Patras, the coach station is located in the center of the city, at 2 Zaimi Str. and Othonos Amalias Str. (www.ktelachaias.gr)

2. From Athens city center

By train and bus

From Larisa Station (also Metro station) you get the suburban train to Kiato. From Kiato there is a corresponding bus to Patras. The Patras' train station is at the center of the city. This is the most convenient and cheapest way to come from Athens Airport to Patras.

By bus

You have to go to intercity coach station called "KTEL Peloponissou". Metro station "Eleonas" and then bus to station. As soon as you arrive there, you can get from the info-ticket desk a ticket to Patras ("IIATPA"). One way ticket costs $18.90 \in$. The first morning bus departs at 05:30 a.m. and the last night bus at 22:00 p.m. The frequency of departures is about every half hour Mon-Sat and less frequent on Sundays. Keep in mind that bus routes marked EXPRESS go to Patras directly from Athens, without making intermediate stops, so it worth's waiting half an hour to board on express bus.
